



**Heading for the exits?...Hard to say if the Enron debacle caused the avalanche or was just part of it, but lots of restructuring projects are faltering: **Arizona** rethinks its year-old experiment amid suspicions of no benefit to most consumers; **Florida** lawmakers greet much-ballyhooed how-to-do-it study with a resounding lack of interest in taking up a proposal; **Ohio** officials admit falling far short of their 20-percent goal for customer switching, citing low electric rates and few competitive suppliers; other states report similarly unexciting results—undoubtedly better than the exciting ones in—**California**. The proposed **transmission line** between Wausau and Duluth creeps forward as the **Wisconsin Supreme Court** declines to hear a lawsuit challenging the constitutionality of the law authorizing an independent transmission company. The private Utah facility for spent nuclear-plant fuel, a project of **Dairyland Power Co-op** and seven other generators, gains importance with environmental approval from the **Nuclear Regulatory Commission**. A new federal report predicts further delay—to 2015—for Nevada’s embattled **Yucca Mountain** storage site, once planned for 1998.—*Dave Hoopman, Wisconsin Federation of Cooperatives***
